Credential Programs

Pro Cert for Teachers

Classes available for graduate degree, as part of a master's program, non-credit program for \$1000, or online for graduate credit.

Principal Certificate Program

Twenty-four credits available through weekly classes in Spokane and Wenatchee.

Program Administrator Cert Program

Twenty-four credits available through weekly classes in Spokane and Wenatchee.

Superintendent Certificate Program

Twenty-four credit cohort program delivered in monthly seminars across the state.

Education Programs available on the WSU Spokane campus

WSU Spokane proudly offers select graduate programs in the College of Education. Spokane programs often include a rich combination of face-to-face, online and distance delivered classes to bring quality education experiences to students.

Co-location with the Pullman campus enables local educators to enjoy coursework that is shared between the two campuses over the Academic Media System. In many cases, students never leave Spokane to complete their programs of study.

Additionally, statewide programs assemble diverse cohorts of educators who meet at various locations around the state to engage in scholarly discussion and research.

Graduate Degrees

Educational Leadership Doctorate

Cohort based program designed around the theme of leadership for school improvement. Seventy-two graduate credits, available on four WSU campuses. Classes offered to meet the schedules of working practitioners, with two-week summer institutes on the Pullman campus.

Teacher Leadership Doctorate

Designed for K-12 educators with a strong desire to collaborate around the complexities of practice. Seventy-two graduate credits, available on four WSU campuses. Classes offered to meet the schedules of working practitioners, with two-week summer institutes on the Pullman campus.

Curriculum and Instruction Master's

Designed for current educators who wish to extend their knowledge and skills in education. Thirty-five graduate credits with classes offered to meet the schedules of working practitioners. C&I specialization may include coursework from the WSU Pro Cert, and/or endorsement programs, including some online offerings.

Educational Leadership Master's

Designed for current educators who wish to pursue careers in leadership positions in the education setting. Thirty-five graduate credits with classes offered to meet the schedules of working practitioners. Ed Leadership specialization may include coursework from the principal and program administrator programs.

Master in Teaching (Elementary)

The MIT program prepares students who already have a bachelor's degree to become effective elementary teachers. A full-time, cohort-based program, that includes 51 semester hours that are shared between Spokane and Pullman.

Teaching Endorsements

English Language Learners — Online

The endorsement is added to an existing valid teaching certificate. The ELL Endorsement consists of 18 semester hours, including a practicum in your linguistically diverse educational setting. Coursework for the ELL endorsement may be applied to the C&I master's degree on the Spokane campus.

Middle Level Math Endorsement

The add-on endorsement program is designed for new and experienced teachers who wish to add additional endorsement or expertise in middle level mathematics to their current certification. Coursework for the math endorsement may be applied to the C&I master's degree on the Spokane campus.

Reading Endorsement

Provides the skills and strategies necessary for those who wish to increase dramatically their knowledge of the teaching of reading. Candidates must complete 13 credits (in addition to meeting program pre-requisites) and pass the WEST-E assessment. Reading endorsement courses may be applied to the C&I master's degree on the Spokane campus.

Special Education — Online, and AMS Videoconference instruction

Includes 31 semester credits and provides the skills and knowledge required for those who want to teach students with special needs at grades P-12. Graduate courses for the endorsement may be applied to the C&I master's degree on the Spokane campus.

Pathway 2 Endorsements

Pathway 2 involves passing the WEST-E test and a college-administered pedagogy assessment in the endorsement being added.
